

The Equity in Athletics Disclosure Act was adopted by the Federal Government in 1994. Under the regulations set forth in this Act, "All coeducational institutions of higher education participating in any Federal Student Financial Programs (Pell, Federal SEOG, Federal SSI, Perkins, Federal Work Study, Federal Family Education, and William D. Ford Federal Direct Loans) and having intercollegiate athletics programs must provide information concerning their intercollegiate athletics programs." The Act requires the information be based upon the previous report year and be available for inspection by students, prospective students, and the public by October 15 each year. This information is available online at <http://ope.ed.gov/athletics/>.

Note: Mid-Plains Community College (MPCC) has two individual NJCAA Athletic Programs and therefore has 2 head coaches for each of the following teams: Men's Basketball, Women's Basketball, Women's Softball, and Women's Volleyball. The MPCC Coed Rodeo Team also has 2 head coaches; a head coach for the rough stock events and a head coach for the timed events.
